Notes from Load Management

The Load Management program is in place for the 2024 irrigation season. The control season begins May 1st and ends September 30th. Control hours are 12:35PM to 9:15PM. There is no control on Sundays and Holidays. Accounts dropping off in May will be charged a \$30 fee. Accounts can drop off and re-enroll for September with no penalty.
