STEALING COPPER HAS A HUGE COST

Thieves like to steal and sell the soft, reddish orange metal to make some quick cash. However, they may sacrifice more than they gain, since stealing copper can cause serious injuries or death. Copper thieves could also face hefty fines and prison time.

The FBI attributes copper theft to disruptions in the flow of the following: electricity, telecommunications, transportation, water supply, heating, security and emergency services. It presents a risk to both public safety and national security.

Common targets for copper theft include farm equipment, air conditioners, abandoned buildings, construction sites and electric utility equipment, including substations and power poles.

The majority of copper theft occurs at night or on the weekends. Detecting and reporting suspicious and illegal activity could help save a life.

Notes from Load Management

The Load Management program for PREMA has come to an end for 2023. We were in active control for 27 days. Total savings for the year was \$409,000. Days in active control and total savings were below the average from past irrigation seasons due to the abundant moisture PREMA's irrigation customers received.

Starting in 2024 PREMA's power supplier Tri State, will change the Irrigation Rate Structure. There will be a reduction in kWH (energy) and an increase in kW (demand). PREMA has not set the rates for 2024, however we anticipate to mirror the decrease in kWH and increase in kW. Along with the rate change, Tri State has reduced the peak period from 12PM - 10PM to 1PM - 9PM. This will shorten the control period by two hours. Participating in Load Management will help offset the increase in the demand charge. If interested in participating in Load Control for 2024 you can call the office at 308-762-1311 and talk with Nick Paradeis or Tim Sherlock. Our office will be closed Thursday, November 23rd & Friday, November 24th for Thanksgiving Day.
