# **PREMA Supports the WNCC Powerline School**

In 2015, Panhandle Rural Electric (PREMA) Board of Directors pledged a donation of \$25,000 to WNCC to be paid in five annual installments. The final \$5,000 was paid in November. This donation added to the fundraising campaign called *WNCC Works: Expanding the Possibilities*. This investment was earmarked for expansion of the current WNCC Powerline School specifically, the construction of a building allowing for an indoor pole lab.

This expansion has given the students the venue to set poles, climb poles and excavate, all indoors. The new indoor facility has enhanced recruitment and training helping to meet the demand for powerline technicians.

PREMA has always been a strong advocate for the Powerline School. One of the ways Panhandle Rural Electric shows support is by hiring students after graduation; PREMA has employed seven powerline graduates since the inception of the program. PREMA also enhances the students' learning experience by hiring them for their apprenticeship requirements which allows students to have real-world experiences before graduation. Another way is by offering, annually, a \$1,000 scholarship for a person attending the 12-month Powerline Program.

According to General Manager, Ryan Reiber, "We want this program to grow and improve so that PREMA and the area utilities can have the best linemen serving their customers. It is wonderful to have opportunities like this, which encourages hometown youth to stay in the area."

- 3. Copy of your college entrance examination (ACT and/or SAT) scores. (Only college Freshmen)
- 4. Essay- Describe how cooperatives can be economic engines for their local communities.
- 5. Applicant Appraisal.
