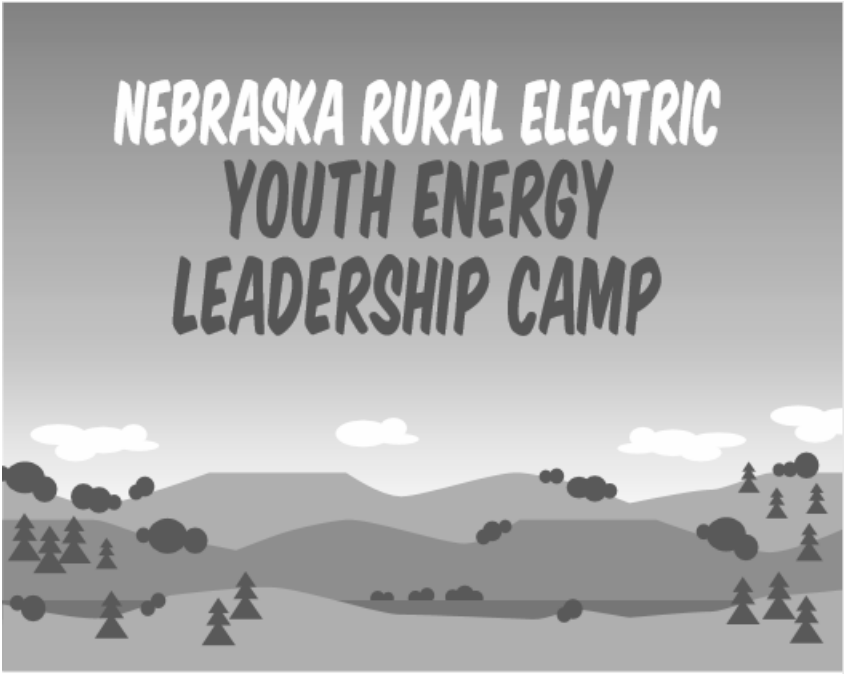

Statement of Non-Discrimination
